How have we been faithful to these values? Examples: virtual worship; drive-through communion; zoom Bible study; virtual Sunday School; daily devotions; member check-ins; zoom group meetings, real and virtual food drives, support to community organizations coffee conversations etc

How can we continue to be faithful to them? **how can we grow** with and through them? (perhaps engage congregation in this process?)

Other principles:

health and safety of members and staff is highest priority;,
drives time frames and plans
science informed decisions
multiple sources of information—synod, local, state govt, experts,
consider tech capacity—members? church?
consider demographics, health status—generally and specific
consider staff capacity—time, expertise, health, etc
commitment to 2-way communication,
commitment to continuing education and engagement of congregation
consider insurance requirements, limits

Realities: life is different, will be different, for individuals and our collective family of faith uncertainties and risks will persist we are a resurrection people; we are a resilient community of faith we live from a place of hope and abundance undefined end point

Images/metaphors: journey—St Paul's journey;

creative wonder of anticipation, possibilities

faithful and creative responses; beyond maintenance to growth!

Opportunities/ functions to plan for :

worship and gathering—many forms

church related activities within building—prayer, mediation, bible study, meals, education church related activities in outdoor spaces

Scenario planning—both format and timing-- driven by guiding principles, conditions and capacity Task: Develop a chart of options and considerations to guide the journey—flexible to changing conditions, needs

Thoughts/ideas:

continue virtual options commit to hybrid, mixed-media offerings series of short services?, with time between building open for prayer/meditation outdoor/camp services matins?, vespers?, evening prayer?

emphasis on spoken participation (but not communal recitation); music provided, not sung service flow available to print and bring, including children's activities

how to create community for baptisms, funerals, etc

how to move forward with communion—at services, continue with drive through?

Consider: Plenty of hand sanitizer, masks available, etc

Management of "touched surfaces", public spaces Traffic flow—one way in, out; restroom guidance

Seating—spaced? if outdoors, self-provided? church provided?
